




What are the objectives?

To protect and promote rights and values as enshrined in the EU Treaties and the EU Charter

by **supporting civil society organisations** and other stakeholders active at local, regional, national and transnational level,

by encouraging civic and democratic participation, in order to sustain and further develop open, rights-based, democratic, equal and inclusive societies based on the rule of law





CERV Programme – Four strands

Union Values

protect and promote Union values by providing financial support to civil society organisations active at local, regional, national and transnational level

Equality and rights

promote rights, non-discrimination, equality, including gender equality, and advance gender and nondiscrimination mainstreaming

combating racism, xenophobia and all forms of intolerance

protect and promote the rights of the child

protect and promote the rights of people with disabilities

protect and promote EU citizenship rights and the right to the protection of personal data

Citizens' engagement

raise awareness of the common European history

promote citizens' engagement and participation in the democratic life of the Union

promote exchanges between citizens of different Member States (town-twinning and networks of towns)

Daphne

preventing and combating genderbased violence against women and girls and domestic violence

preventing and combating all forms of violence against children, young people and other groups at risk

supporting and protecting victims



What is new in CERV

Union Values (Regranting)

- New call with 50 million euro (2021)
- 2,5 4,5 million euro per organisation
- Re-granting scheme to support small and grassroots NGOs
- → Soon for framework partners (5,6 million euro in 2022)

National Contact Points

- 27 national relays (so far 19 appointed)
- Providing guidance and practical information
- assistance to applicants, stakeholders and beneficiaries

Multi-year work programme

- 2021-2 Work
 Programme with 292
 million euro
- Advanced planning for all calls
- Bigger transparency and earlier information for stakeholders
- → multi-year priorities

Merging of two programmes

- Rights, Equality and Citizenship 2014 2020 – combating racism, genderbased violence,...etc
- Europe for Citizens 2014-2020 – citizen engagement and participation, towntwinning, European remembrance



1. Capacity-building and awareness raising on the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights

To contribute to the effective and coherent application of the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights, in line with the Strategy to strengthen the application of the Charter in the EU and to foster a culture of fundamental rights in the Member States.

2. Activities on strategic litigation

To strengthen the knowledge and ability of practitioners, legal professionals, civil society organisations and independent human rights bodies to effectively engage in litigation practices at national and European level, and to improve access to justice and enforcement of rights under EU law, including the Charter, through training, knowledge sharing and exchange of good practices.

First-ever call on EU Charter and strategic litigation (previous pilot project)

28 October 2021 – 24 February 2022 (17 weeks)

2 million euro with min. single grant of 75.000 euro

Single applicant or consortium

National or transnational projects

Only organisations established in the EU

Project duration max. 2 years



Eligible entities

- legal entities (public or private bodies, profit or non profit)
- international organisations and civil society organisations,
- · national human rights institutions, equality bodies and Ombuds Institutions
- Member State authorities

Actions

- capacity building and awareness raising activities aiming to increase the knowledge and the use of the EU Charter:
- facilitating cooperation between key actors in enforcing the Charter;
- Training/train-the-trainer activities, mutual learning an development of learning methods for professionals;
- analytical activities, such as data collection and research as well as communication activities

Impact

- increased awareness and better use of the Charter;
- improved knowledge about available redress mechanisms;
- improved cooperation between CSOs, NHRIs, Equality bodies, Ombuds Institutions and Member State
- increased ability to develop a litigation strategy, and communicate and advocate around it,
- increased ability to bring strategic litigation cases before courts (national and EU).


