- Insufficient choices & support
- Insufficient funding
- Short-term planning

- Wide range of support services catering
 - to the diverse needs of people
 - with disabilities
- 66 [Deinstitutionalisation cannot work] without having community services in the town.



ACTIVE COOPERATION

• Engaging people with disabilities & their families



GUIDANCE

- Information for people with disabilities
- and their families on community living Strong capacity of support staff



• Cooperation between sectors at the local level

BARRIERS

Poor communication among different providers
Lack of clarity over who does what



• Full involvement of people with disabilities & their families
