

Presentation of the Fundamental Rights Report 2019 - Rome - 24 October 2019

The European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights (FRA) processes the personal data of a natural person in compliance with Regulation 2018/1725 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 and Decision No 1247/2002/EC.

This privacy notice explains FRA's policies and practices regarding its collection and use of your personal data, and sets forth your privacy rights. We recognise that information privacy is an ongoing responsibility, and we will update this notice where necessary.

1. Why do we collect personal data?

FRA collects personal data in the context of the 24 October 2019 workshop in Rome presenting the FRA Fundamental Rights Report 2019.

The collected data will be used to inform invitees about the programme as well as to share the workshop report and photos/videos of the panellists taken during the event for enhancing the visibility of the event.

2. What kind of personal data does the Agency collect?

FRA collects personal data related to identification and contact details of the workshop invitees like name, surname email addresses, profession, organisation and type of organisation. FRA may take videos and photos of the panellists during the workshop.

3. How do we collect your personal data?

FRA together with the co-organiser of the meeting, Roma Tre University/Department of Political Sciences will jointly collect personal data using emails, excel sheets and paper format. Fondazione Giaccomo Brodolini will process the collected personal data on behalf of FRA.

4. Who is responsible for the processing your personal data?

FRA and Roma Tre University/Department of Political Sciences are the legal entities jointly responsible for the processing of your personal data and determine the objective of this processing activity. The FRA Head of Communication & Events Unit and the Director of the Department of Political Sciences of Roma Tre University are responsible for this processing operation.

5. Which is the legal basis for this processing operation?

Organising various events is necessary for the functioning of the Agency. Therefore, the processing is lawful under Article 5(a) of the Regulation (EU) No 2018/1725. In addition, since the participation to the events is not mandatory, the processing of the personal data is also in accordance with Article 5(d) of Regulation (EU) No 2018/1725.

6. Who can see your data?

Your personal data are stored in an electronic database. Access to the database is restricted to authorised staff members of the FRA as well as authorized staff of Roma Tre University/Department of Political Sciences and Fondazione Giaccomo Brodolini.



7. Do we share your data with other organisations?

No, your personal data is processed by FRA, Roma Tre University/Department of Political Sciences and Fondazione Giaccomo Brodolini. In case that we need to share your data with third parties, you will be notified to whom your personal data has been shared with.

8. Do we intend to transfer your personal data to Third Countries/International Organizations

9. When we will start the processing operation?

We will start the processing operation upon your registration to the event.

10. How long do we keep your data?

Your personal data for up to three months from the date of the workshop.

11. How can you control your data?

You can access, modify or delete your personal data by sending an email request to franet@fra.europa.eu or cristiana.carletti@uniroma3.it or info@fondazionebrodolini.eu

11.1. How valuable is your consent for us?

Consent/explicit consent in case of sensitive data

You have the right to withdraw your consent at any time, and we will delete your data or restrict its processing.

11.2. Your data protection rights

Under data protection law, you have rights we need to make you aware of. The rights available to you depend on our reason for processing your information. You are not required to pay any charges for exercising your rights.

a. Can you access your data?

You have the right to receive confirmation whether or not we process your personal data. Furthermore, you can have access to such data, as well as obtain copies of your data undergoing processing, at any time and free of charge, by sending an email request to fra.europa.eu



b. Can you modify your data?
You have the right to ask us to rectify your data you think is inaccurate or incomplete at any time by sending an email request to franett@fra.europa.eu

You have the right to update or correct your identification data at any time.

c. Can you restrict us from processing your data?

You have the right to block the processing of your personal data at any time by sending an email request to franet@fra.europa.eu when you contest the accuracy of your personal data or when the Agency no longer needs the data for completing its tasks. You can also block the processing activity when the operation is unlawful, and you oppose to the erasure of the data.

d. Can you delete your data?

You have the right to ask us to delete your data at any time by sending an email request to franet@fra.europa.eu the processing activity is unlawful.

e. Can you request the transfer of your data to a third party?

This only applies to information you have given us. You have the right to ask that we transfer the information you gave us from one organisation to another, or give it to you. The right only applies if we are processing information based on your consent or under a contract or in talks about entering into a contract and the processing is automated.

You are not required to pay any charges for exercising your rights. We have (time period) to respond to you.

f. Do you have the right to object?

Yes, you have the right to object at any time by sending an email request to franet@fra.europa.eu when you have legitimate reasons relating to your particular situation. Moreover, you will be informed before your information is disclosed for the first time to third parties, or before it is used on their behalf, for direct marketing purposes.

The Agency will address your requests within 15 working days from the receipt of the request.

q. Do we do automated decision making, including profiling?

12. What security measures are taken to safeguard your personal data?

The Agency has several security controls in place to protect your personal data from unauthorised access, use or disclosure. We keep your data stored on computer systems with limited access to a specified audience only.

13. What can you do in the event of a problem?

- a) The first step is to notify the Agency by sending an email to franet@fra.europa.eu and ask us to take action.
- b) The second step, if you obtain no reply from us or if you are not satisfied with it, contact our data protection officer (DPO) at dpo@fra.europa.eu.
- c) At any time you can lodge a complaint with the EDPS at http://www.edps.europa.eu, who will examine your request and adopt the necessary measures.

14. How do we update our privacy notice?

We keep our privacy notice under regular review to make sure it is up to date and accurate.
