Saša Gajin Ph.D. is a professor of human rights law, equality law, media law and the law on information at the Faculty of Law, Union University, Belgrade. Saša is a deputy-director of the Centre for Advanced Legal Studies (CALs), a Belgrade-based NGO specialized in drafting legislative proposals. He is a principal co-author of ten laws adopted by the Parliament of the Republic of Serbia in the period 2003-2014, including the media legislation, freedom of information law, personal data protection law, law on data confidentiality, law on prohibition of discrimination and the law on prevention of discrimination of persons with disabilities. He is also a principal co-author of the new law on personal data protection and the law on free legal aid, which are pending the adoption.

Saša is a member of the European Commission against Racism and Intolerance (ECRI) of the Council of Europe, elected for the period 2017-2022. In the period 2007-2017 he served as a deputy-member of ECRI.
